

GUIDELINES FOR POSTER PRESENTATIONS

<u>General Advice</u>. During the poster session, the presenting author is expected to explain the work orally to any interested parties. The header of your poster should state the title followed by the authors and organizational affiliations. Each poster should have the following sections: (i) *problem definition and objectives* (a brief introduction to the problem and a concise statement of objectives are presented); (ii) *strategy, methods, theory* (the methods to address the research objectives emphasizing novel theoretical and experimental approaches are described); (iii) *results* (using appropriate tables and graphs, the research findings are presented); (iv) *conclusions* (conclusions and their significance are presented); (v) *references* (only key references must be mentioned so as to commit adequate space for the above-mentioned sections of the poster); (vi) *acknowledgements* (this section is to be kept brief to one or two sentences). The following suggestions may be useful when preparing your poster: (i) the poster sections should be self-explanatory; (ii) each section in the poster should be clearly marked with a title; (iii) the lettering must be such that the poster is readable from a distance of up to 2 meters; (iv) where possible bullets, instead of full sentences, should be used to convey the message; (v) all tables and graphs should have captions and the axes of graphs should be clearly labelled; (vi) tables and graphs ought not be overloaded with data.

<u>Set-up Details</u>. The maximum size for the poster is **190 cm (height)** \times **90 cm (width)**. This size limit applies to all posters. Each poster board at the meeting will have a designated paper number assigned to each board. Your paper number will be the same as the paper number listed in the programme booklet, which you will receive at the Registration Desk.

Posters will be displayed in the **Foyer of Emerald Ballroom in the Grand Hotel Bernardin Convention Center (11th floor)**. During this period, supplies (mounting pins, tapes, etc.) will be made available. You should place your poster on the board bearing your paper number.

POSTER SESSION

<u>Set-up Time</u>. The set-up period for poster presenters is on **Wednesday**, 18 September 2024, 08:00-14:30.

<u>Session Time and Date</u>. The poster session will be held on **Wednesday**, 18 September 2024, 16:30-18:00. Authors should remain with their posters for the duration of the session, as indicated in the conference programme.

<u>Poster Removal</u>. You should remove your poster at the latest after the morning coffee break on **Thursday, 19 September 2024, by 11:00**. After that, the posters will be removed by members of the organising committee and we cannot accept responsibility for any damage or loss.
